5.4 REPORT OF THE CHIEF NURSING OFFICER	<ul> <li>A briefing note on collaborative partnerships between nurse educators from Niagara Health System (NHS) and SJHH and between SJHH nurses, physicians and inter-professional colleagues in the Women's and Infant's Program and McMaster University was provided.</li> </ul>
5.5 VICE PRESIDENT RESEARCH	<ul> <li>J. Gauldie gave an overview of the Research Institute (RI) of SJHH. Noted that the RI placed 25# in the top 40 research hospitals in Canada. It was noted that over 900 publications have been published over the past three years. It was also highlighted that in a two month period, the Firestone Institute for Respiratory Health had five publications in the prestigious clinical journal The New England Journal of Medicine. Various other Research Institute achievements were highlighted.</li> <li>It was noted that "opt out" arrangements are now in place with respect to "Access Research". This will allow our patients the best possible opportunities to participate in world class research here at SJHH. It was noted that a detailed process and standard operating procedures have been developed.</li> </ul>
5.6 REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF STAFF	<ul> <li>An update on the recommendations of the Hospital University Liaison Committee on the Post-Graduate Workforce was provided.</li> <li>Dr. Dan Perri has accepted the position of Chief Medical Information Officer effective December 1<sup>st</sup>. Dr. Chris Hayes was thanked for his tremendous contributions in leading SJHH through the very successful implementation of Dovetale.</li> <li>Updates on the Strategic Plan Research Working Group, External Review of the Head and Neck Oncology Program and physician recruitment were provided.</li> <li>Discussion occurred with respect to the Clinical Teaching Unit (CTU) situation and it was noted that discussions are ongoing with McMaster University, Hamilton Health Sciences and St. Joseph's Healthcare.</li> </ul>
