



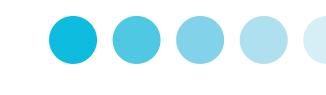

	The summary report was highlighted and updates on SJHS, HHT/OHT, JBG Committee Workplans, Quarterly Strategic Plan Report, Board Briefing notes and Annual JBG Skills Matrix Survey were provided. An article published in the Globe and Mail was shared with the GMV for information - "Not for Profit Boards Also Need Diversity. If Not Now Then When?". A Nominating Committee update was also highlighted. TREASURER'S REPORT FROM THE RESOURCE AND AUDIT COMMITTEE Overview of the Treasurer's Report was highlighted. Highlights include audit plan and the letter of engagement for SJVD, 2019/20 insurance claims review for all three organizations, Q1 Quality Committee for SJVD and SJHC, CAPS for SJVD and SJHC, Covid-19 update/risks and mitigating strategies, and annual insurance review and renewal update were provided. An update on the hospice loan agreement was provided and it was noted that robust discussion occurred at the Resource and Audit Committee with respect to this loan.

Discussion

- A special thank you was extended to Dr. H. Boyd, the Medical Director at SJVD, and teams at both the hospital and SJVD for their incredible support during this difficult time. Staff have come together and have developed many creative solutions related to staffing, engagement of residents, etc. Preparations are currently underway to recognize both residents and staff during the upcoming Christmas Season.
- It was noted that during a recent Family Council Meeting, the Committee made note of how thankful they were for all of the tremendous efforts of the SJVD staff during this challenging time. In response to a question, it was noted that information updates are sent to families on a daily basis.

SJHH

- Dr. Z. Chagla, an Infectious Disease at SJHH provided a Covid-19 update and a
 presentation on Covid-19 projections which highlighted case counts, community
 transmission rates, processing of tests, hospitalization rates including ICU
 capacity, access to care, as well as a review of the latest Hamilton data. In
 response to a question, it was noted that 30% of the cases are related to
 community transmission at this time.
- An update on the outbreak on CTU Central was provided. It was noted that an
 enormous amount of contact tracing was carried out by the hospital. Noted that
 data related to healthcare worker transmission is tracked by the Province. The
 Ministry of Labour was called when this outbreak occurred, which is a normal
 part of the process when an outbreak occurs and no orders were received.
- SJHH is partnered with forty two congregate settings at this time, with nine
 homes currently in outbreak and five homes that SJHH is actively supporting. A
 process is in place to reach out, check and monitor the situation at these various
 settings. It was noted that homes can request additional support from a
 management and operational perspective.

REPORT OF THE EVP AND CHIEF NURSING EXECUTIVE

A briefing note was provided on the nursing workforce and Covid-19
preparedness. Recruitment efforts and other strategies which have been
implemented in order to maintain a high level of quality of care and to further
pandemic response preparedness were highlighted.

REPORT OF CHIEF OF STAFF

 The findings of the Physician Engagement Survey were highlighted and it was noted that there has been overall improvement from the 2018 scores. Scores within the various disciplines were discussed.

REPORT OF SJHS PRESIDENT AND CEO

- Thanks were extended to the JBG for their understanding in modifying the agenda format to allow the teams to focus on Covid-19 pandemic issues.
- A SJHS update for all organizations was provided.
- A fulsome update on Covid-19 pandemic related issues from the perspective of SJHS was provided.
- All SJHS partners are working together to realize many opportunities in the health sector.
- Thanks were extended to Dr. J. Gauldie, who is retiring at the end of December.
 His tremendous contributions and impact during his term as Vice President Research were recognized.

DEAN. FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES

- Ongoing collaboration between the University and SJHH is very strong at this time.
- Challenges related to the University in the current educational environment were outlined. It is not ideal, but given the challenges, virtual learning is going well.
- An update on various new academic appointments was provided.
