Encouraging correspondence has been received from MOH re: funding for Bill 124 impacts, but health care facilities are awaiting funding letters for further clarity and administrative details. An update on the Investment Monitoring Committee was provided. A cyber security update was pre-circulated. A regional advisory group is being coordinated and SJHH will have representation on this committee.

	 CHAIR'S REMARKS Dr. Lehana Thabane has been awarded a very prestigious award - an Honourary Doctorate from Stellenbosch University in South Africa. C. Yendt beginning ICD studies at Rotman. Congratulations were extended on this achievement. A presentation will be presented by BLG on the Not for Profit Corporations Act, 2010 (Ontario) "ONCA". This will be presented on October 10th 530 to 630. This

REPORT OF THE DEAN, FACULTY OF HEALTH SCIENCES

REPORT OF PRESIDENTS

SJVD

- Situational updates were provided on respiratory seasonal planning. Priorities and planning and team, culture and resilience updates and mission moments, milestones and growth were highlighted.
- It was noted that masking is resuming in resident facing areas.
- Ministry of Long-Term Care was on site this week following up on an order.
- Ministry of Labour carried out a blitz inspection and it was noted that the visit went well.
- There is a focus on education for teams on how staff treat each other as well as residents and families.

SJHC

- Situational updates were provided on the pandemic response and Community Support Services Programs.
- Priorities and planning, team culture and resilience and mission moments, milestones and growth were also highlighted.
- SJHC continues to experience challenges but the team is excited about the strategic work currently underway.
- SJVD and Villa Foundation members carried out a site visit at First Place.
- An update on the ICC program was provided noting increasing 'affordability' pressures for patients and families. A series of MH&A in-service events will occur for all ICC Program staff across HNHB region participating hospitals.
- A question was asked about HCCSS restructuring announcement (consolidation to single Shared Service Organization). Consultations with stakeholders will begin in October.
 - An update on the OHW requested Home Care Modernization proposals was provided

SJHH

- Situational updates including preparing for respiratory season, models of care innovation fund proposals, and improving mental health awareness were overviewed. Priorities and planning, team culture and resilience and mission moments, milestones and growth were also highlighted.
- Preparations are underway for the Fall and Winter. Projections are being reviewed with hospital/regional partners at this time. Ontario Health has asked all hospitals to prepare surge plans up to 20%. Options are currently being explored, recognizing that Hamilton will be particularly challenged to handle this level of surge given limited capacity in the region to relieve ALC pressures.
- Noted that there has been a return of mandatory masking this week for healthcare workers in areas where patient activity takes place. In addition, visitors are encouraged to mask in these areas.
- Model of care innovation proposals have been submitted. Over 400 proposals have been submitted throughout the Province, with 193 from West Region alone.
- The official opening of the Centre for Integrated and Advanced Medical Imaging (CIAMI) occurred last month—an extraordinary collaboration among Hamilton

hospitals, McMaster and Mohawk College to advance diagnostic imaging research and education, while also providing access to MRI services.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE VP/CHIEF NURSING EXECUTIVE

- It was noted that healthcare organizations are experiencing an ongoing shortage of health care workers, difficulty recruiting regulated professionals and a shift in the depth of experience across our teams. It was noted that the professional practice team is focusing on using roles to full scope and best focus, reviewing orientation and onboarding processes in light of a less experienced workforce, ensuring resources are available to enable ongoing development, evaluate introduction of new roles and evaluating a new team based approach to care.
- It was noted that the MOH is extending the nursing extern program and the international program to the end of the fiscal year.
- There was some interest in board members attending Professional Advisory Committee meetings. It was noted that the PAC does not have the same legislative obligations as the MAC. REPORT OF CHIEF OF STAFF

- Two sessions were hosted last week for all physician leaders which centered on accreditation readiness. The service leadership event was held this past Tuesday, which for the first time included all physician leaders.
- An update on Chief Search Committees Critical Care and Diagnostic Imaging were provided.
- Pediatrics has undergone many challenges and all leadership, including the Chair of the Department and the co-deputy chiefs were recognized for their tremendous efforts with respect to coverage.
- A thought leadership forum was held last week including participants from New Zealand, UK and BC. This was designed to highlight successful international, national and local initiatives that support the journey towards integrated care and discuss opportunities for collaboration, integration, and innovation in order to accelerate health system improvement in Ontario

REPORT OF SJHS PRESIDENT AND CEO

- An update on the SJHH President Search was provided. It was noted that first and second round interviews were held over the past few weeks and a preferred candidate has been identified.
- An update on the SJHCG President Search was provided.
- An update on internal searches for the SJHS was provided.
- The SJHS Strategic Plan will be officially launched on October 26th.
- The Chairs Liaison Committee took place recently and an update was provided.
- An executive compensation review across the SJHS will be taking place.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT, MEDICAL STAFF ASSOCIATION

- N. Amin gave the report of the Medical Staff Association.
- Introductory meeting was held in September. Noted that MSA has historically been providing staff awards to deserving staff members and it is currently brain storming other ideas for this important recognition.
- The next meeting will be during Learning Pillar Week. Invitations have been extended to Drs. Higgins and Ingram to participate as guest speakers.
