Laser Eye Treatment

What is Laser Eye treatment?

Laser eye treatment sends a laser beam through the cornea to the retina at the back of the eye. The retina is the part of the eye that allows you to see.

Why do I need Laser?


- Prevent a retina detachment
- Reseal a retinal tear to the wall of the eye

The day of your appointment:

- Plan to arrive no more than 15 minutes before your appointment time.
- You will be getting dilation drops and should arrange for someone to drive you after your appointment.

When you arrive:

- 1. Clean your hands with the pump provided.
- 2. Sit in the waiting room
- 3. Wait to be called to the Registration desk. You will be called according to your scheduled appointment time not the time you arrive
- 4. Register at the Registration desk when called. Be prepared to show your Ontario Health card.
- 5. After registering, a technician will put drops in your eye to dilate it.
- 6. When your eye is dilated the technician will take you to the laser exam room. Laser treatment takes about 15 minutes.



Plan to be at the Eye Clinic about 1 hour. There are many doctors and patients in this clinic for many tests and procedures so you may see people go in "out of order".
